From the Treasurer

CHOC maintains \$6,000 in reserve to handle rally expenses that must be paid before the rally fees begin coming in. To date, \$1,600 of this reserve has been spent on the upcoming fall rally. Since the club actually has more than this available in its treasury, the board authorized a \$1000 contribution to the spring rally (of which \$462.61 was actually used). The board also authorized a \$1500 contribution to the fall rally. As you can see below, we anticipate having almost \$3,700 excess in the treasury at the end of the year. The board will continue to lessen this excess by subsidizing future rallies.

News from Coach House

Coach House has been very busy this year refining what we feel is the best RV in its Class. We've introduced several improvements and innovations that continue to be very well received and thankfully we continue to build and sell at capacity. This year some of the improvements have been offering more choices with our interior colors. We now have three interior ultrafabric colors; crème, grey and camel along with two cabinet colors; Lakeside Cherry and Honey Maple. We've added a new



feature providing three options to most of our slide-outs; power theater seating with swivel tables, dinette and power sofa. In our very popular 271XL and 272XL models we have a no cost option to extend the galley, which replaces the third seat and dramatically increases the counter and storage space. Pioneer radios with navigation, color backup camera, AM/FM/CD and XM/Sirius Radio (ready), dual 6-volt Lifeline batteries, 1000 watt inverter and new flooring are now standard features.

We've also spent some time on the exterior. We are now offering a no charge full body paint option with two colors; desert or shadow. Same material, same excellent finish. Running board and awning LED lights provide good visibility in the dark. The awning LED is on a rheostat and can be dimmed or shut off if you choose. External HDMI, coax outlets, new HD TV antenna and propane connections are now standard.

Other neat items we've recently introduced as additional options are; a new Winegard automatic in-motion satellite system with receiver for both DirecTV and Dish networks, 13' legless power awning, Bose sound bar, larger capacity solar chargers, auto start generator module, Alcoa aluminum rims, new exterior fiberglass doors (Mercedes), cell phone amplifier and Wi-Fi booster.

Many of you have asked about our new expansion project and where it stands. Well as many of you know, dealing with local city government can be challenging. The planning department has approved the plans and they are now in the hands of the building department. Comments have been sent back and forth and hopefully we are near the end. We are meeting with the contractor and should have this wrapped up within 3-4 weeks with construction starting immediately after. Hopefully we will have the lights on by the end of the year.

We hope everyone is doing well, enjoying their Coach House motor homes and CHOC is thriving. We certainly appreciate your business and kind words throughout the year. Please keep the pictures of your travels coming. We really enjoy seeing and posting them to our Facebook account.
